

CAPP HIGHLIGHTS

- CAPP provides a one-stop point of access for a substance user who wants help to be assessed for the level of care of treatment needed for their situation and a point person to help obtain that care
- CAPP staff assesses for level of care and advocates for appropriate treatment
- CAPP staff works with the Public Health Network in identifying gaps in the region
- CAPP staff utilizes recovery coaches as a bridge for the ChAARI program

CHAARI HIGHLIGHTS

- The Cheshire County Addiction Assistance Recovery Initiative (ChAARI) is a component of CAPP
- ChAARI staff schedules 24/7 recovery coaches to be deployed to the Cheshire Medical Center emergency room when needed
- The ChAARI program works with all emergency responders, emergency room staff, and fire departments throughout Cheshire County

What is CAPP?

How will CAPP help?

The Coordinated Access Point Program (CAPP) is a pilot program of Southwestern Community Services (SCS), created to address the current opioid epidemic. This initiative provides a single point of contact for individuals who want to begin treatment to recover from their addiction. CAPP augments the ongoing work of the many state, regional, and local entities striving to make a difference and save lives.

Addiction is chronic and progressive, yet it is a treatable disease. The Coordinated Access Point Program provides information and referrals to available services for those afflicted with addiction as well as for their families and loved ones. It helps fill the gap that has previously existed for those seeking help.

CAPP will provide a level of care assessment for the participant and will then assist the participant in getting services identified in the assessment.

Serving the Monadnock Region, the Coordinated Access Point Program works with individuals and families in crisis due to addiction. CAPP is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The staff is prepared to take information and refer a contact to appropriate services existing within the service area.

HOW CAPP WORKS

For those who are seeking information or treatment for a substance abuse issue, help is available. CAPP will use a coordinated entry approach and will provide a rapid response to anyone suffering from addiction and looking for a way out.

CAPP staff may also provide limited case management to ensure follow-up and follow through on any referrals.


